Time Travellers

Go on a time travelling adventure and discover how things changed over time! Be transported back in time with our interactive and hands-on workshops.

Curriculum Links

KS1

- Events and life beyond living memory.

KS2

- An aspect or theme in British history that extends pupils' chronological knowledge beyond 1066.
- Local history study.

Pupils will get the opportunity to explore two of the following time periods:

Stone Age to Iron Age (Stone Age Tools)

Pupils will get the chance to explore a range of real Stone Age tools, learn about flint knapping and create their own replica hand axe or arrowhead to take home with them.

Anglo-Saxons (Battle of Maldon)

Pupils will hear the tale of this local historical event and then be led through a re-creation of the battle.

Victorians (Victorian Classroom)

Set in our Victorian classroom pupils will be given an authentic lesson from a role play teacher. Pupils will practise writing slates, learn their timetables Victorian style and find out what discipline was like in Victorian schools.

World War I (Life on the Home Front)

Using a combination of role play drama and object handling, pupils will explore three key elements of life on the home front in Essex—the Zeppelin raids over Braintree district, women's war work in local industries and the billeting of soldiers in Braintree.

World War II (World War II Classroom)

An authentic wartime classroom session allowing pupils to capture the essence of 1940s education.

During the afternoon session, pupils will then get the opportunity to explore the Museum's main galleries.
